



# Super Easy Table Leg Mod

Okay, so for those of us larger folks out there that find the dinette table a tight fit here is what I did.

I went to my local RV dealer and purchased these folding table legs that I used to have on my Rockwood Pop Up. \$26.00

I like these better because I can move the table where ever I want, and it allows me more room to scoot into the dinette and get to the overhead cabinets because I can shove the table to one side or the other, or easily pull it out completely for total access.



This is the folding part that attaches to the TM wall. I just removed the screws from the piano hinge closest to the main table section, thus allowing me to remove the 4" folding piece. I stored it for future if I ever need it

I put the leaf in place on the table. This will now be a permanent table size. You will not be able to remove the leaf.





## Old Table Leg & Bed Support Leg

I decided to leave these on if possible. Turns out they didn't really interfere, but I had to put them in the upright position.

I figured that I could always use the main support leg as added support, and while I don't expect to ever need to fold it down into a bed, I wanted to keep that leg support just in case.



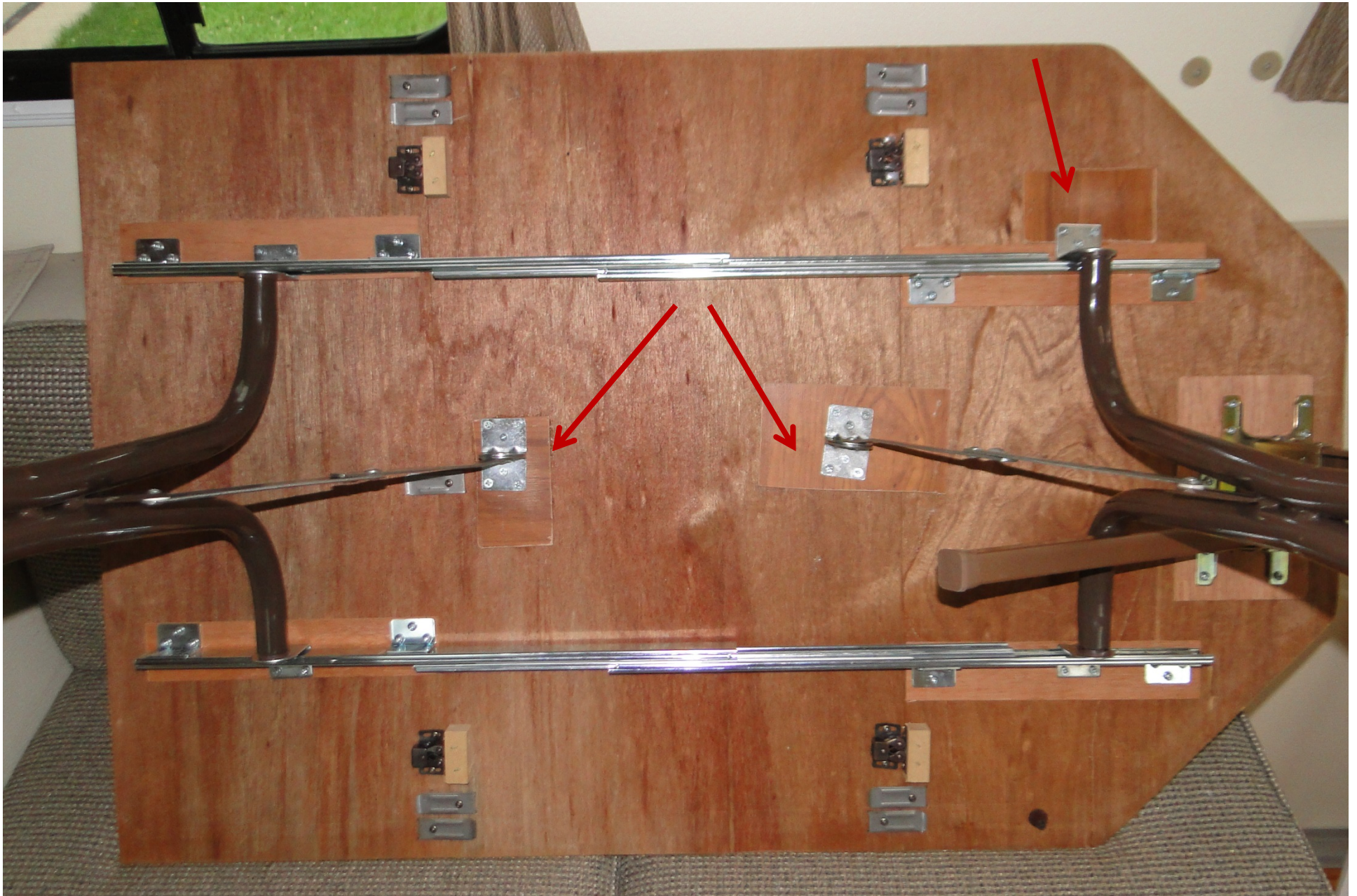


## Underside of Finished Table

You can mostly fold the bed support leg out of the way and the main support leg can be either extended down as added support or just partially folded away.

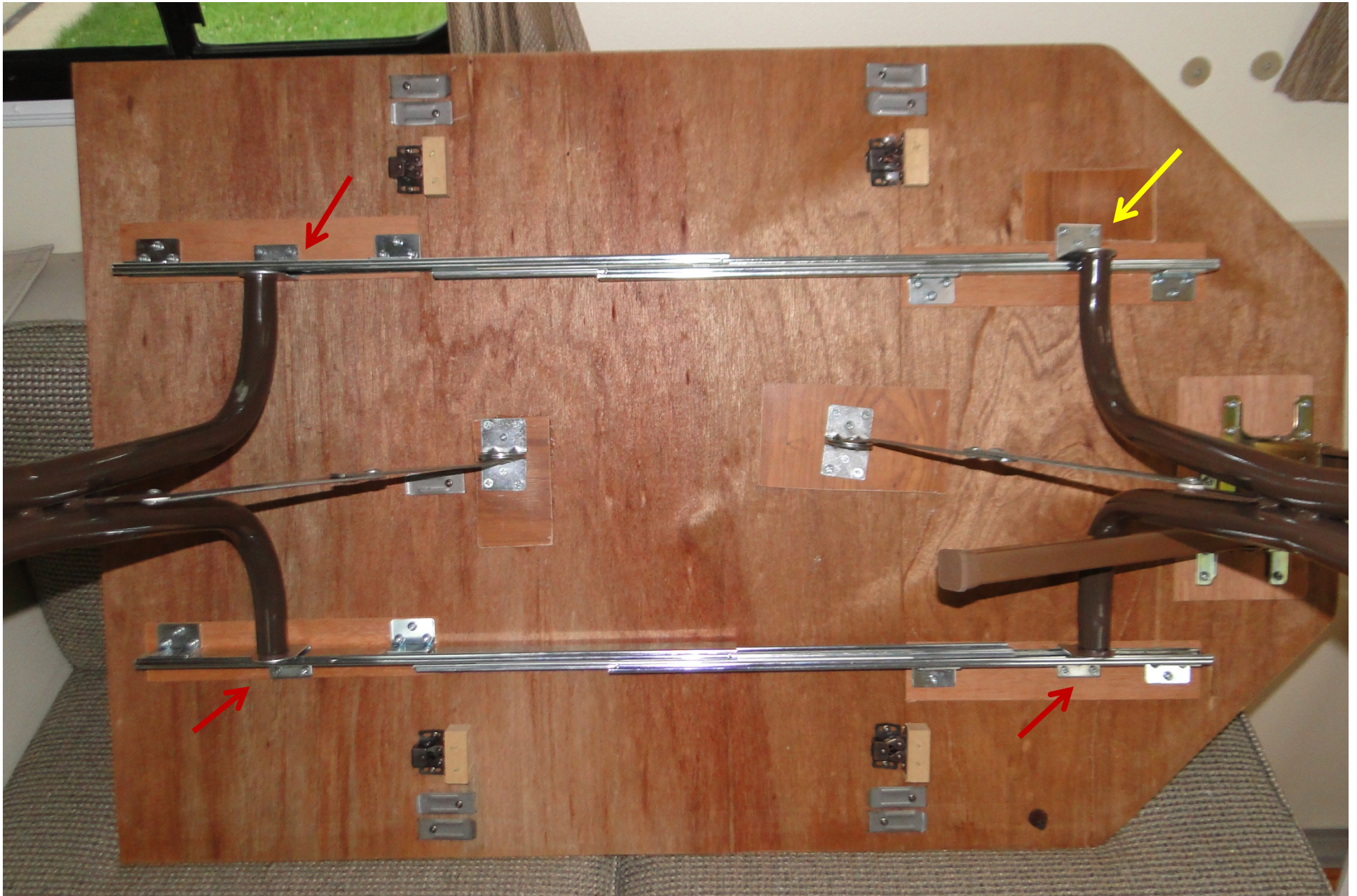


Had to add thin wood pieces here to make it level with the other areas. TM used a thin piece of wood to add extra for the screws to bite into.





Three of the four legs were able to be secured underneath the sliding table leaf mechanism (red arrows). One side would easily slide underneath, then the other side I had to remove the screws of the fastener, and then slide the leg under. The fourth one (yellow arrow) had to be secured on the outside of the mechanism, thus requiring a thin piece of wood to match the height.

## Showing underside of table.

The red arrows show the original legs. These can be folded partially under the table. Yellow arrows show where you fold the new legs. They don't fold perfectly flat, but neither did my old pop up camper table legs. I will probably use bungee cords to hold them in place while in transit.
